

LADIES' KENNEL ASSOCIATION.

At a meeting of the Council of the L. K. A. of America, held on May 15th, with Mrs. Kernochan in the chair, the Association was advised that word had been received from the president of the K. C. (L. B.), that Mrs. Kernochan, Mrs. Vatable and Miss Bird had been elected honorary members of that organization, and that the K. C. (L. B.) would offer for the competition of members of the L. K. A. of A. its medals for the best in each breed, subject to the rules of the K. C. (L. B.). Miss G. Shippen was appointed a delegate to the Council.

At a regular meeting, held on the same day, there were present Mesdames Kernochan, Vatable, Mayhew, Foote, Smyth, Brazier, Kerr, Williamson, and Misses Hatch, Lawrence, Shippen and Bird.

The secretary's report was read, and showed an increase in membership of thirty-eight since the annual meeting in January, and cups have been offered and won at the different shows as follows: Providence, 4, won 1; New York, 22, won 11; Pittsburgh, 5, won 3; Boston, 10, won 6.

The winners at Pittsburgh were: Vancroft, Swiss Mountain Kennels' Endcliffe Bishop; Suffolk, Swiss Mountain Kennels' Prof. Ruskin; Cairnsmuir, Mrs. Mayhew's Hands Up. At Boston: Ballyhoo Bey, Mrs. Brazier's Gusto; Champion, Swiss Mountain Kennels' Endcliffe Bishop; Vancroft, Swiss Mountain Kennels' Endcliffe Bishop; Suffolk, Swiss Mountain Kennels' Hatcham Nip; Meadows, Meadows Kennels' Team, Harris & Nixon, Mrs. Davis's Edgewood Cold Steel.

Mrs. Smyth wins the Vancroft cup outright, with Endcliffe Bishop, this being the first of the Association's cups to be won outright.

The advisability of holding a show was discussed, and the conclusion arrived at that unless a large guarantee fund should be subscribed, it would be an unwise decision. The treasurer's report was read and approved, and the meeting adjourned.

Lassie made her first appearance at

the Westminster Kennel Club Show this year, under a specialist judge, where she beat everything, taking first in her class and specials for the best Welsh Terrier dog or bitch. She is a grand Terrier all over, teeming with quality and perfect in color, having that deep, rich tan marking and black saddle which is so much desired. She has a grand head, with beautiful expression, fine front and short, well-ribbed body. Her weight is nineteen pounds. A glance at her pedigree will prove that she has a wonderful combination of the best blood. On her sire's side, Twm is by the old dog, Pym, and on the dam's side, Sincinor is by the celebrated Torgoch, and Mischief is by Carnarvon Tip. I believe Torgoch is the sire of more good Welsh Terriers than any dog living or dead. A few of the English winners who claim Torgoch as their sire are Brynhir Buckler, Brynhir Brigand, Brynhir Batter, Hard Cash, Lady Crywst, Llanrwst Beauty, Nance Brynafon, Twysog Ergri, and a host of others. With a few more such good specimens on the bench it is safe to say these hardy little Terriers will become very popular. They are very game and make delightful house pets.
